In its fourth year of full classes, the University enrolled over 3,000 students. There are 11 parks in the Prince George District. Crooked River, West Lake, Dahl Lake, Purden Lake, and Eskers Provincial Parks are within on hour drive from Prince George.

If family camping is what you are after, visit Purden Lake at the foothills of the Rockies, and Beaumont Provincial Parks along the Yellowhead, and Crooked River (Bear Lake), Carp Lake and Whiskers Point Provincial Parks on Highway 97 North. These parks have adventure playgrounds, horseshoe pitches, volleyball courts, picnic shelter and tables, and self-directed hiking trails and beaches. A more informal campground on Highway 97 North is Tudyah Lake Provincial Park.

Paarens Beach Provincial Park offers lakeside camping on Stuart Lake. Just a short drive away is the National Historic Park of Fort St. James where history buffs can visit the reconstructed fort and enjoy a guided tour by interpreters in period costume.

Mount Robson Provincial Park, near the Alberta border on Yellowhead Highway 16 offers superb mountain scenery. A popular destination for hikers and mountain climbers, this park has much to offer. The visitors may camp at three campgrounds, fish, swim, use the picnic area, beach, go for shorter walks or hike the Berg Trail.

West Lake Provincial Park, 22km southwest of Prince George, is a popular Day-use area with picnic facilities, beach, and a picnic shelter that can be reserved ahead of time.

Eskers Provincial Park is a day-use destination close to Prince George and offers hiking trails, viewing platforms, as well as canoeing opportunities on several small lakes. Part of the trail is also wheelchair accessible.

Aesthetic Parks

Fort George, Connaught Hill and Rainbow Park: These are designed to provide visually pleasing surroundings, family-oriented activities and special events such as Canada Day celebration and weddings.

Athletic Parks

Blackburn, Carrie Jane Gray, Exhibition, Freeman, Heather and Recreation Place: These are developed to provide quality facilities for athletic activities and are often located near schools.

Natural Parks

Cottonwood Island, Ferguson Lake, L.C. Gunn Park, Wilson Park, Hudson's Bay Slough and Moore's Meadow Nature Park: Natural Parks provide city residents with the opportunity to visit small-scale natural areas without leaving town.

Neighbourhood Parks and Tot Lots

There are approximately 140 parks in these categories. Often located next to schools, neighbourhood parks are convenient for both parents and children. Depending on the area, these parks may include recreational ball diamonds, tennis courts, playground equipment and safe play areas. Designed along the same lines, tot lots are small playgrounds located in residential areas.

In addition to city parks, Forests for the World, located on Cranbrook Hill, is managed by the Forests for the World Commission.
