A variety of rental options cater to the diverse needs of learners both on and off campus. It is paramount that you secure housing before arriving to Canada.

Campus Housing

Located just steps away from the main building, campus housing is a great option for learners looking for affordable access to their classes. Room types vary in size and range between \$2,000 -\$2,160/term. Space is limited so apply early to secure your spot. We recommend you apply six to nine months in advance of your program.

Off-Campus Housing

The city offers a range of rental accommodations, including apartments, basement suites, condominiums, single-family homes, and townhouses. Average rental prices in Prince George typically vary depending on factors such as location, size, and amenities. However, according to Move Up Prince George, you can find one-bedroom apartments starting at \$800 to \$1,200 per month, while larger two or three-bedroom units range from \$1,200 to \$2,000 or more.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What do I need to apply to CNC?

To qualify for admission, you must meet the following requirements:

- English Language Program:
- □ Be 17 years of age
- Certificate, Diploma, Post-Diplomas, Associate Degree, or **University Transfer:**
- □ Be 18 years of age
- Completed high school, or the equivalent of BC Grade 12
- Meet all program requirements
- Meet the English Language requirements:
- View cnc.bc.ca/admissions/transfer/international-equivalencies for the most up to date information

Can I apply for scholarships and bursaries?

Yes, international students can apply for bursaries and scholarships, but they must be attending CNC and be at the college when they apply.

Do I need a study permit to study at CNC?

Yes, all international students must obtain a study permit to study at CNC. You can apply for a study permit as soon as you receive your offer letter.
